Takeshi Arima (Takahiro Miura) is 35 years old, single, and unmarried. His father Hiroshi (Seishiro Nishida), a steeplejack master and master of the "Great Tug-of-War," has been nagging him to "get a wife soon and become a strong heir."

One day, he meets Ji-hyun (Jiyoung), a Korean resident doctor, and they gradually come to know each other.

At the same time, Fumiko (Mako Ishino), the mother of the Arima family,

announces her retirement and abandons her duties as proprietress and housekeeper, leaving Atsuko (Manami Higa), the younger sister, and the rest of the family struggling to cope.

Meanwhile, as the big annual event, the "Great Tug-of-War," approaches, Takeshi is told by Ji-hyun that she will be returning home in two weeks. "What is dating?" "What is marriage?" "What is family?" and "What is determination?"

This is a story of love depicted through two people's love.

Kawada, who is engaged in home medical care, is striving to do his best in the field of medicine every day, despite having some contradictions and conflicts in his mind.

Then, he meets Onuki, a patient with terminal lung cancer. Onuki's daughter, Tomomi, chose to be a "painless home doctor" instead of being hospitalized. In the end, however, Toshio continues to suffer and dies.

He chose the "painless home doctor," but he ended up with the "painful home doctor." Tomomi blames herself, wondering if it would have been better to let him stay in the hospital, or if she killed him by

bringing him home from the hospital. Tomomi blamed herself. These words stung Kawada.

In the meantime, Kawada consulted with Nagano, a senior home doctor. In Nagano's opinion, he should have suspected emphysema rather than lung cancer and treated the patient.

In the end, due to his final diagnostic error, Toshio had no choice but to reluctantly continue suffering and die out. Kawada was tormented with regret, thinking that there were many other things he should have done.
